IMMUNIZATION CLINIC FOR 7TH GRADERS

Immunization reminder for ALL current 7th Graders: If your child will be attending PLMS as an 8th grader during the 2018-19 school year, they will need documentation of having received both the **Tdap and MCV** immunizations prior to the 2018-19 schedule pick-up. Tdap is a booster for continued protection against diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough (pertussis). MCV is an immunization designed to provide protection from Meningococcal disease. If your future 8th grader has received these immunizations, please provide documentation to the Health Room. We will also host an immunization clinic for current 7th grade students on May 4th . Additional information will be sent home later.

LS R7 AND LS POLICE JOIN FORCES TO PRESENT A COMMUNITY CONVERSATION ON SCHOOL SAFETY

The community is invited to attend A Community Conversation on School Safety from 6:30 to 8 p.m. April 25 at the Lee's Summit City Hall, 220 SE Green St. The event is co-hosted by the Lee's Summit R-7 School District and the Lee's Summit Police Department.



Police and school officials will present information about school and community safety efforts, followed by a question-and-answer session featuring a panel including leaders from both organizations.

Presenters and panelists at A Community Conversation on School Safety will include Dr. Dennis L. Carpenter, Lee's Summit R-7 superintendent; Travis Forbes, Lee's Summit Police Department chief; Sgt. Chris Depue, Lee's Summit Police Department public information officer; Dr. Rexanne Hill, Lee's Summit R-7 director of student services; and Ryan Hall, Lee's Summit R-7 supervisor of safety and environmental services.

The community event will be videotaped by the City of Lee's Summit and shared by both organizations following the meeting.

LEE'S SUMMIT JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY

Lee's Summit Junior Police Academy is a week long program that is structured to simulate a professional Police Academy experience for youth between the ages of 12-14. Students attending this academy may also have the opportunity to speak with other local and federal law enforcement such as the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), Secret Service, Sheriff's Department, Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), or Missouri Highway Patrol. The 2018 Junior Police Academy will be held July 23-27, 2018 from 8am-noon. This program is for Lee's Summit residents & LSR7 students. Deadline for the 2018 JPA applications is June 15, 2018.
