

Students participating in any middle or high school Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) sponsored sport or activity are required to pay a yearly participation fee to help offset the costs associated with providing these opportunities. At the middle school level, the participation fee per student is \$25.00.

Athletes must have a completed Privit profile on the <u>PLMS Privit site</u> if they plan on trying out or participating in athletics in the 2022 23 school year. The Physical Form will be good for two years from the date of the exam.
